

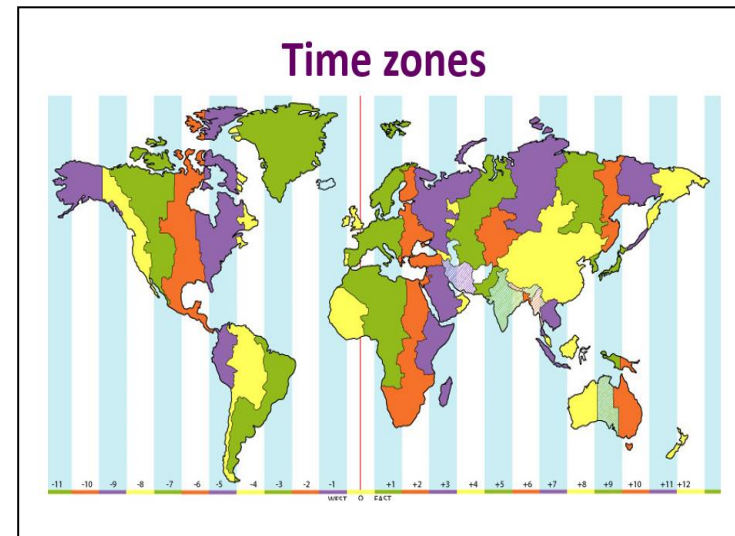
# Geography – Our World

- Can use an atlas or map to find significant places

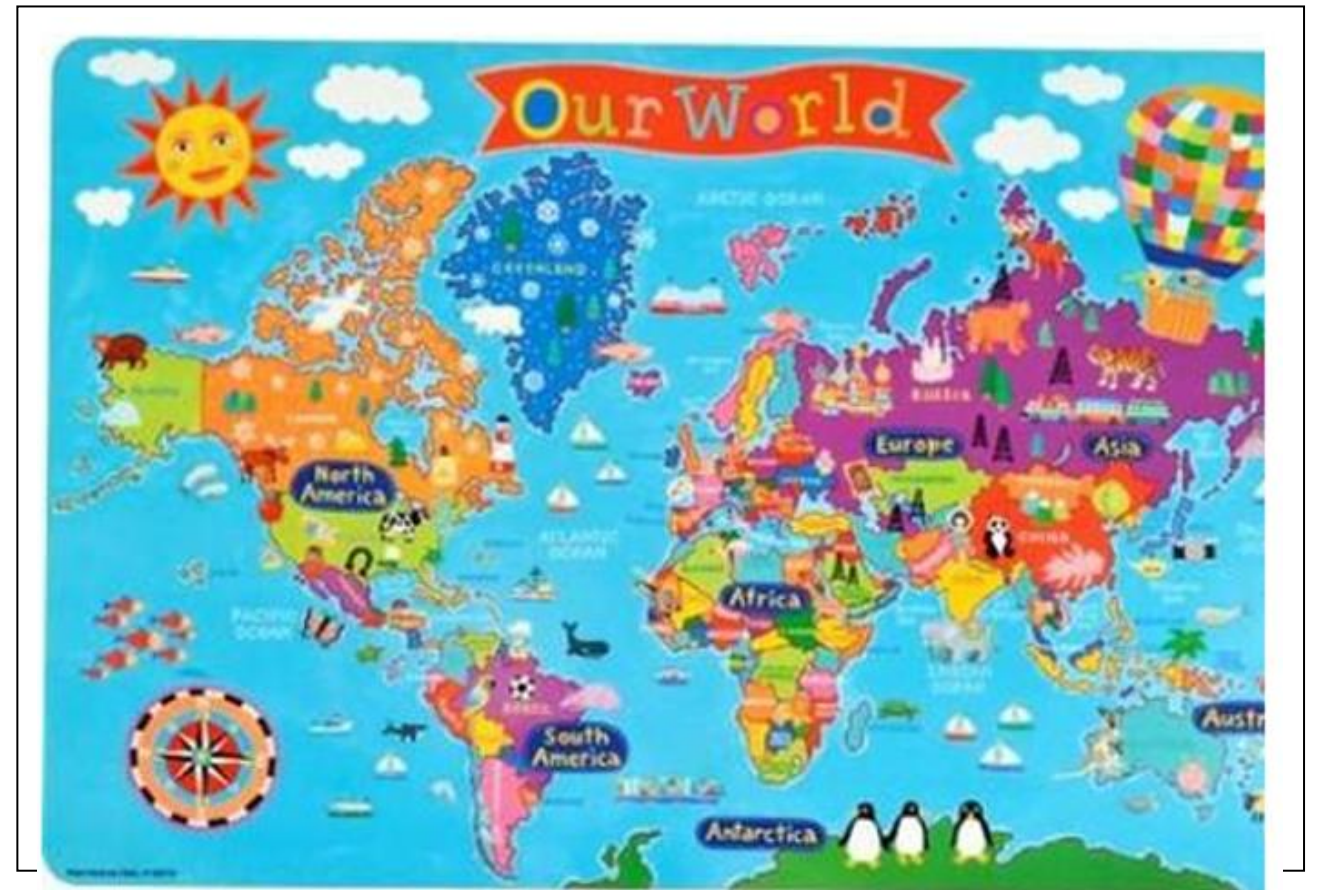
## Key Vocabulary

Northern Hemisphere	half of the Earth north of the equator
Southern Hemisphere	half of the Earth south of the equator
Equator	imaginary line/circle of latitude around the Earth, midway between North and South Poles, dividing the Earth into Northern and Southern Hemispheres.
longitude	geographic coordinate that defines the north-south position of a point on the Earth's surface
latitude	imaginary vertical line used to measure position on the Earth's surface E-W of the Prime Meridian
time zone	area between lines of longitude following/sharing a standard time
