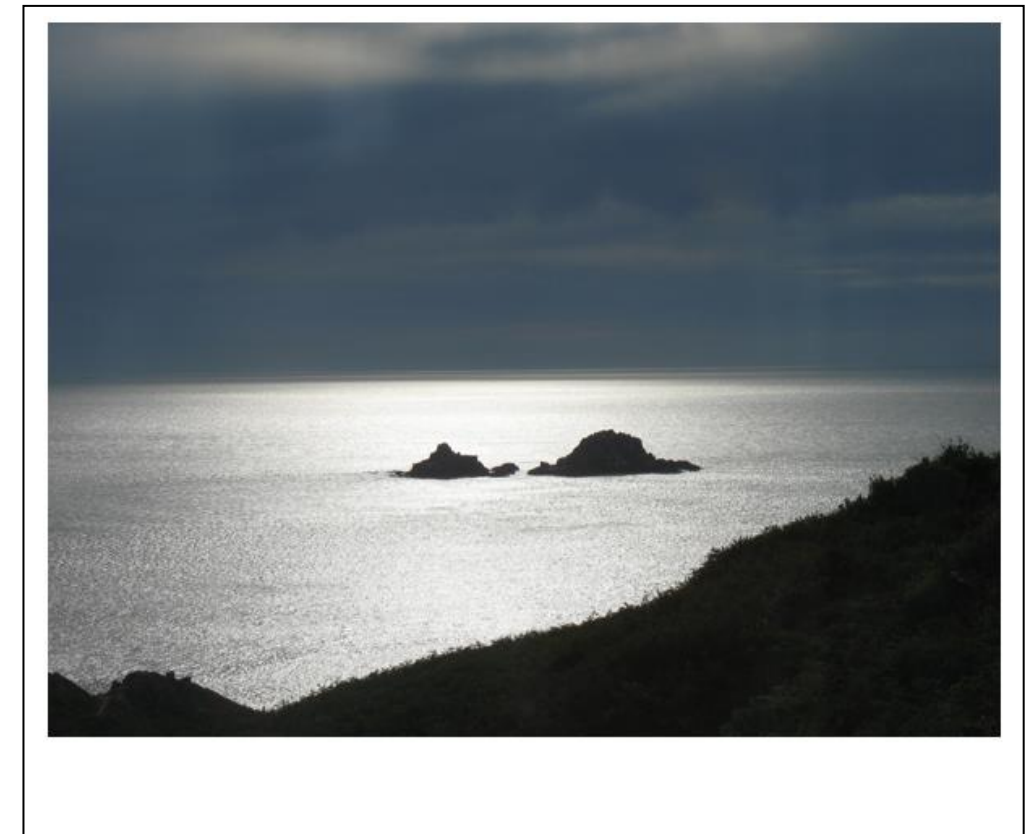
Key Vocabulary

coast	region where land meets sea
headland	land jutting into the sea, usually of harder rock
tourism	a worldwide industry based on travel for leisure, pleasure, business
erosion	process where the surface of the Earth is worn away by e.g. water, wind, waves
tide	periodic rise and fall of the sea caused by the movement of the moon and the sun
port	place where ships load or unload
