

Key vocabulary

Import	Bring (goods or services) into a country from abroad for sale.
Export	Send (goods or services) to another country for sale.
Producer	A person, company, or country that makes, grows, or supplies goods or commodities for sale
Consumer	A person who purchases goods and services for personal use.
Retailer	A person or business that sells goods to the public in relatively small quantities for use or consumption rather than for resale.
Locally sourced	Locally sourced ingredients are items that have been purchased nearby from a farmer, fishmonger or any other fresh produce creator.
